

REGULAR CALLED CITY COUNCIL MEETING
Tuesday, March 20, 2018 – 5:00 P.M.
Council Chambers – Denison, Iowa

The second regular City Council Meeting of the City of Denison, Iowa was held pursuant to law on the above date and hour; Mayor Beymer called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with the following members present: CURNYN, GRANZEN, LOESCHEN Absent: MAHRT

- PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE Mayor Beymer lead the Pledge of Allegiance.
- MOTION TO APPROVE AGENDA Motion Loeschchen/Granzen to approve the agenda. Ayes: 3 Motion carried.
- MOTION TO APPROVE CONSENT AGENDA Motion Curnyn/Loeschchen to approve the following items on the consent agenda: a) approve and waive the reading of the minutes for 3/6/18; b) approve the bills as presented; c) approve budget, cash & activity reports for February 2018; d) approve liquor license(s) for Hillside Grille & El Michoacano. Ayes: 3 Motion carried.
- DEPT HEAD REPORTS
- Snowgren reported that April 7th & 8th will be the county wide fire dept. training. He has been working on preparing for RABGRAI. He received the last bid for the floor drain repairs on the apparatus floor and some new leaks were discovered in the roof of the fire station. He is working on planning the spring open burning dates and getting ready for races to begin.
- Wiebers reported that he is getting prices to repair the nodes and wants to have them done before July 22nd. He reported that the sweeper has been ordered. Wiebers informed council that if they get complaints about Woodland Dr., which is a gravel street, public works is aware of the problem. He also wants to remind residents to make sure to separate brush and yard waste when dumping at the yard waste site.
- Nemitz reported that they have had the sweeper out and have been patching holes. He is getting quotes to repair Charles Street where the hill is sluffing off. He informed council that the bridge approaches are settling, so they have been marked and they are checking into mud jacking them.
- Peters reported that the police dept. had training on Feb. 27th on the new LIDAR. Tammy chapman started on Mar. 6th as a part-time dispatcher and is currently in training. The annual FFA tractor convoy was on Mar. 16th and the St. Patrick's Day parade was on Mar. 17th. The police dept. will be testing to fill dept. vacancies on April 7th.
- Kempfert reported that lifeguard training will be starting. They had 30-40 swim team members advance to regionals. The Little Kickers soccer program has 101 kids signed up and will begin on Apr. 8th.
- Crawford reported that Kempfert is coordinating with the contractor that did the pool relining to come and test the liner when they fill the pool, probably late April.
- Walley reported that the library meeting room use continues to be

strong. The library is always looking for new program ideas, so please feel free to contact her with ideas. They have held 18 programs so far this month and kicked off RAGBRAI informational meetings yesterday. Walley wanted to express a thank you to Kendall VonGlan and Kempfert for helping with maintenance issues at the library. The library did not receive any funds for the foundation repair project from the Omaha Foundation.
